EndNote Web®

The new *EndNote Web* provides bibliographic management on the Web. Users can import and edit references via a personal Web account and use these references to cite in papers and create bibliographies. *EndNote Web* searches *ISI Web of Knowledge*SM, *PubMed* and hundreds of online library catalogs to help users build their personal reference collections easily. *EndNote Web* includes unique integration for *ISI Web of Knowledge* subscribers with dynamic links to “Times Cited” and related records, giving users one-click access to the latest information on a reference article.

The addition of *EndNote Web* helps undergraduate students organize their references for citing in papers. For the professional researcher and graduate student who depend on *EndNote* and other desktop writing tools, *EndNote Web* is the perfect complement for storing references. Now the millions of *EndNote* users who demand a robust desktop writing tool with a higher degree of accessibility and control can be even more productive using the combination of *EndNote* and *EndNote Web*.

With *EndNote Web*, users can:

- Search *ISI Web of Knowledge*, *PubMed* and hundreds of library OPACs directly
- Import references from hundreds of online bibliographic databases
- Store up to 10,000 records per user account
- Edit reference detail—add notes, keywords, modify the contents of any field
- Use over 2,300 publishing styles to format in-text citation and bibliographies
- *Cite While You Write*TM in Microsoft Word (requires plug-in)
- Format papers in other word processors using RTF (rich text format) files
- Simplify collaboration with colleagues—share *EndNote Web* folders
- Use *EndNote Web* toolbars in Internet Explorer and Mozilla to access their reference libraries in one click, and capture citation data easily (requires plug-in)

Answers to Common Questions about *EndNote Web*:

Is *EndNote Web* the same as *EndNote*?

No, *EndNote Web* is not the same as *EndNote*, as *EndNote Web*'s primary purposes are:

- 1.) To aid faculty and students who write papers occasionally or for specific courses and whose bibliographic management requirements are satisfied with a Web service.
- 2.) To complement *EndNote* by offering a convenient way for *EndNote* users to access the basic functionality of *EndNote* via the Web when away from their own computers. Users (graduate students, researchers and faculty) who are writing papers more than occasionally and require more comprehensive functionality (like storing PDF's, creating and saving advanced searches, citing tables, figures and equations, to name a few) would still want to use *EndNote*.



What are the direct searching capabilities of *EndNote Web*?

The first generation of *EndNote Web* will allow for direct searching on the *ISI Web of Knowledge* platform, *PubMed* and Library OPACs. *EndNote Web* users working with other online resources (like EBSCO, ProQuest, Ovid and OCLC) are able to save their references as a tagged text file and then use the *EndNote Web* import filters to transfer their data into *EndNote Web*. (Note: Users of *EndNote* can directly export references from other online resources).

What major features does *EndNote* provide that *EndNote Web* does not?

- Store PDF files with references
- Create and save advanced searches
- Customize views and displays
- Directly export references from different platforms
- Edit reference import filters and output styles
- Use term lists for auto-entry
- Cite tables, figures and equations
- Work Offline
- Local Personal Files and Documents

Does an institution have to be a subscriber to one of Thomson Scientific's products (e.g., *Web of Science*, *Biosis*, etc.) in order to use *EndNote Web*?

No, an institution does not have to be a Thomson Scientific subscriber in order to enjoy the benefits of *EndNote Web*—it is available for purchase as a stand-alone product. However, if an institution is currently a subscriber or will become a subscriber to at least one of Thomson Scientific's products on the *ISI Web of Knowledge* platform or is an *EndNote* site licensee, *EndNote Web* would then be free.

Is *EndNote Web* available as an individual subscription?

Not at this time.

When will *EndNote Web* be available?

EndNote Web is expected to be available in the fourth quarter of 2006.
